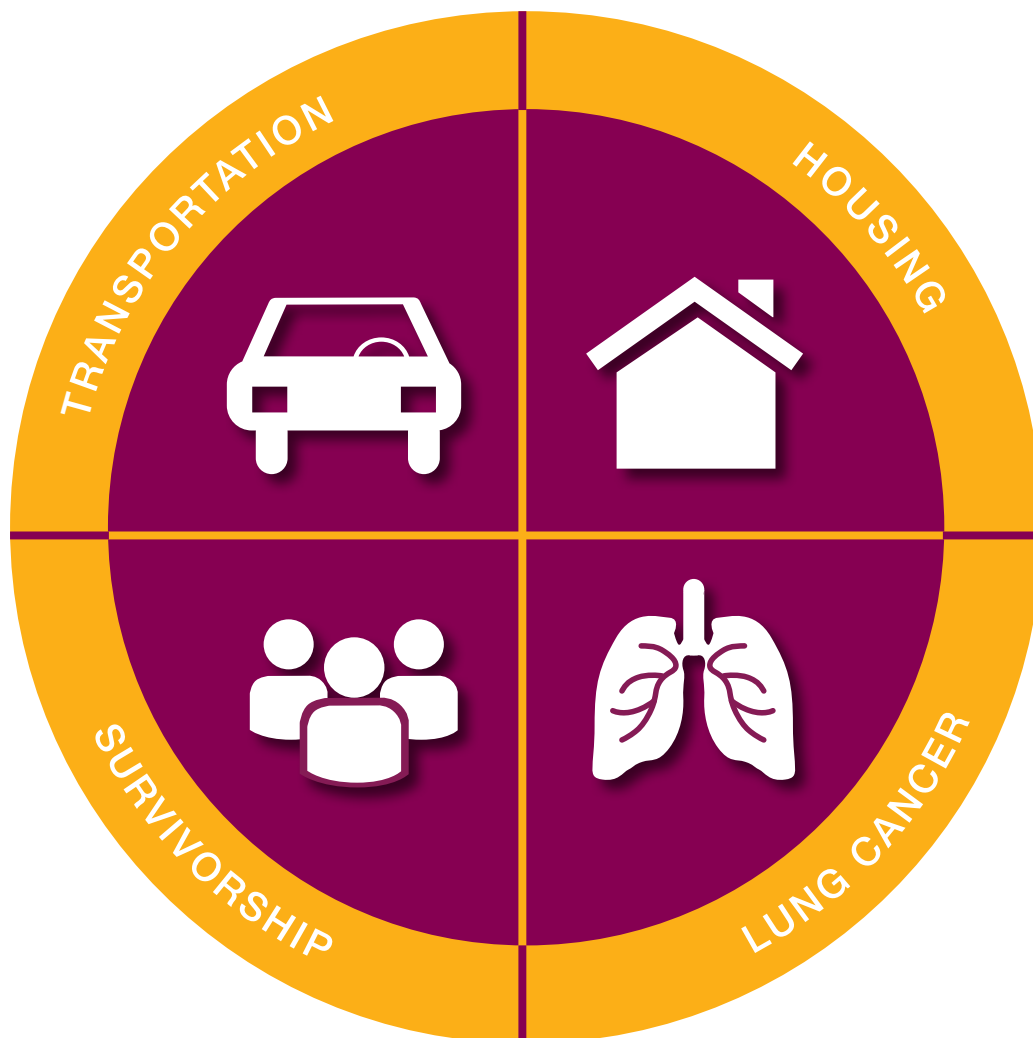

SUPPORT IS AVAILABLE FOR PATIENTS *who* REQUIRE ASSISTANCE

TRANSPORTATION, LODGING, AND SURVIVORSHIP

- Patients with cancer face many challenges along their treatment journey, especially when treatment requires daily, long-distance travel and/or extended absence from work or family
- Encourage patients to seek national and/or local programs that may offer logistical support



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THE PATIENT JOURNEY CAN BE MADE EASIER WITH *the* RIGHT SUPPORT

Adequate transportation to and from appointments/procedures, affordable lodging, and the ability to find the right assistance programs are important considerations for patients undergoing active therapy



Help with air travel and/or ground transportation during treatment is available from multiple organizations



Seek lodging support from hospitals and/or treatment centers that provide short-term housing or discount programs with nearby motels/hotels for patients and their caregivers



Encourage patients to seek information or help from their cancer care social worker regarding survivorship support



Take advantage of specialized support groups (ie, those dedicated to patients with lung cancer) to help overcome the challenges of cancer treatment
